ACT OF THE SENATE

TO
PREVENT promiscuous behaviour in the Fourth Rome

Be it enacted by HIS IMPERIAL MAJESTY THE FAITHFUL PAVLOVIAN EMPEROR AND AUTOCRAT OF THE ROMANS AND ALL RUS', Defender of the Faith, Turtle and Elephants, in the Eighth year of His Imperium and in the first year of the consulate of Princes Christophoros Sclagamarus filius Drakon and Comes Eduardus Robertus filius Gundersovus, in the year Seven thousand Five hundred and twenty eight after the creation of Adam, by and with the advice of all Senators, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- I. This Act places a categorical ban on illicit sexual behaviour.
- II. For the purpose of this Act, "illicit sexual behaviour" is defined as any sexual activity save for sexual intercourse between a husband and his wife for the purpose of procreation, including:
 - A. Pleasure sex
 - B. Adultery
 - C. Fornication
 - D. Masturbation
 - E. Sex trafficking
 - F. Fetishism (as defined in [LXXIV Alex IV Anti-Furries Act](#))
 - G. Objectification
 - H. Production, distribution and consumption of pornographic materials
 - I. Flirting
 - J. Kissing
 - K. Cuddling
 - L. Petting
 - M. Sexting
 - N. Cybersex
 - O. Nudity, save for physiological or medical needs, or for changing clothes
 - P. Cross-dressing
 - Q. Usage of contraceptives
 - R. Any other sexual activity explicitly not mentioned in this Act
- III. Recognising the severity of the above transgressions, a Pavlovian subject found guilty of illicit sexual activity shall lose their noble title if they be noble, whipped 80

times, exiled from the Empire and proclaimed enemy of God, Emperor and Fatherland.
