**ACT OF THE SENATE**

TO  
*UNRECOGNISE* abstract art and dadaism as valid forms of art and to embrace traditional standards of art

*Be it enacted by* **HIS IMPERIAL MAJESTY THE FAITHFUL PAVLOVIAN EMPEROR AND AUTOCRAT OF THE ROMANS AND ALL RUS'**, Defender of the Faith, Turtle and Elephants, in the Eighth year of His Imperium and in the first year of the consulate of Princeps Christophoros Scлагamarus filius Drakon and Comes Eduardus Robertus filius Gundersovus, in the year Seven thousand Five hundred and twenty eight after the creation of Adam, by and with the advice of all Senators, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- I. abstract art and dadaism shall be recognised as invalid forms of art and should not be considered art at all, this includes paintings that do not represent or mean anything
- II. embracing traditional standards of art:
  - A. art has to represent something and needs to have a meaning to be recognised as art, this doesn't only includes only paintings, but sculptures and statues
  - B. art has to be original and shall not deface another art (ex. adding moustache to Mona Lisa)
