

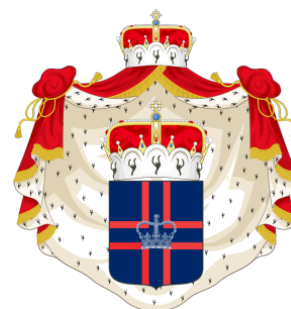


Treaty of Mutual Recognition and
Establishment of Bilateral Diplomatic
Relations between the

EMPIRE OF PAVLOV

AND THE

Grand Duchy of Klitzibürg



The Governments of the **Empire of Pavlov** and the **Grand Duchy of Klitzibürg**, hereinafter referred to as “The Parties”, acting on behalf of their Nations through peaceful dialogue and diplomacy; recognizing democracy as an instrument of national self-governing; respecting the freedom of religion and conscience; refusing from any forms of racism, segregation, national or ideological intolerance; condemning whatever form of authoritarian governance as a violation of human rights, hereby declare the each other’s recognition as micronational governmental entities, and as a basement for such decision, deliberate:

Preamble

To conclude the Treaty of Mutual Recognition and Establishment of Bilateral Diplomatic Relations consisting on the following points, as proof of a good will existing between the Empire of Pavlov and the Grand Duchy of Klitzibürg

Parties

- For the Empire of Pavlov
 - His Imperial Majesty Alexander IV to Christ the God Faithful Pavlovian Emperor and Autocrat of the Romans and of all Rus', of the Great, the Little and the White, Semper Augustus, etc. etc. etc.

- For the Grand Duchy of Klitzibürg
 - His Royal Highness, Nicholas Erichiel Henry Charles Joseph Ferdinand Hans de Franz Maria Krüchz von Göth I., Grand Duke of Klitzibürg, etc, etc. etc.

Article I

Recognizing the Vienna Convention of 1963, the Nations, mentioned in the Preamble, agree to open diplomatic missions of each other, such as Embassies and if considered necessary, Consulates; physical or virtual, in venues, suitable for both

of them; such Embassies shall be created by the Foreign Ministries or substituting them institutions of both countries; diplomats shall be nominated for the work in these missions via agreement between the Governments of both countries.

Article II

1. Communications between the diplomats of both countries shall be taking place primarily through diplomatic missions, mentioned in the Article 1; conflicts, occurring in the middle of such communications, shall be dealt with through non-public dialogue.
2. All correspondences between both countries shall be considered as confidential except any that both parties have decided to be public.
3. Communications between the diplomats of both countries shall be made only in English language and will be made in a manner of mutual respect.

Article III

1. The Parties recognize each other's countries as sovereign and independent entities; the legitimacy of documents, issued by those; honorary citizenship and noble titles, passable in both countries.
2. Both Parties shall recognize the noble titles in both countries and will use them respectively.

Article IV

This Treaty envisages the existence of mutually beneficial contacts and collaborations, development of bilateral dialogue in cultural, social and humanitarian fields. Agreements, stating the conditions of such contacts and collaborations, can be signed independently or as an addition to this Treaty.

Article V

In case of violation of this Treaty by either side, the signatories are to discuss the situation through diplomatic dialogue; failing this, the treaty shall be considered as void.

Article VI

1. That the title of Pavlovian Emperor and Autocrat of the Romans and all Rus' is rightfully held by His Imperial Majesty Emperor Alexander IV of the House of Tezdzhan-Smahin and his legitimate successors under Pavlovian law, and that those who hold the right to the title of Emperor of the Romans are the Pavlovian Emperors and those they recognise as holding said right.
2. Recognition of other Emperors shall not mean a de facto or tacit recognition, but instead the "Emperors" in question are to be recognized solely as of the Caesarian rank, not as a Augustus.

Article VII

This Treaty is signed for two years with the possibility of extension, initiated by the parties; can be a subject of amendment, by the agreement of both Parties; can be terminated by either Party with prior notification, not later than 2 (two) weeks before the planned date of termination.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF the undersigned Plenipotentiaries have signed this Treaty.

Done at Harlemum on the third day before the Ides of June in the first year of the consulate of Princeps Christophoros Sclagamarus filius Drakon and Comes Eduardus Robertus filius Gundersovus in the 8th year of the Imperium of Dominus Noster Imperator Caesar Alexandrus Augustus Censor Perpetuus and the 4th year of the Imperium of Imperator Caesar Anscharius Augustus, in the Year Seven thousand five hundred and twenty eight Anno Mundi
